

YELLOW BUS ENCOURAGES RIDERSHIP

The Yellow Bus Program, created in 2015, encourages higher school bus ridership and reduces the number of parents driving their children to school, thus helping to reduce traffic congestion on Tiburon Boulevard. In the upcoming 2016-2017 school year, seven buses will serve 13 routes. The Belvedere Community Foundation supports the Yellow Bus Program through a grant to build and install a tracking application for each school bus to relay real time information on arrival times, delays, and cancellations to parents via text message.

CONCERTS SHARE SOUNDS OF SUMMER






FRIDAY NIGHTS ON MAIN

COMMUNITY FLOCKS TO WATERBIRD FESTIVAL

The Belvedere Community Foundation was a proud supporter of the 3rd Annual Waterbird Festival held at Richardson Bay Audubon Center & Sanctuary on February 6, 2016. It was free community event which included naturalist led bird

walks, bird scope stations to gain closer looks at the waterbirds



visiting our Bay, interactive educational activities, and expert speaker sessions. Richardson Bay Audubon Sanctuary's waters are part of an important bird area that welcomes tens of thousands of migrating waterbirds each winter as well has the Pacific herring upon which the birds feed.
